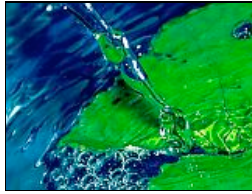

NASA scientists say space observations of freshwater storage are providing a new picture of how Earth's most precious natural resource is distributed.

Researchers are using the nearly 5-year data record from the Gravity Recovery and Climate Experiment, or GRACE, to estimate seasonal water storage variations in more than 50 river basins that cover most of Earth's land area.

The twin GRACE satellites monitor tiny month-to-month changes in Earth's gravity field that are primarily caused by the movement of water in Earth's land, ocean, ice and atmosphere reservoirs.

Scientists from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration and the University of California-Irvine presented the research Tuesday during the American Geophysical Union meeting in San Francisco.
